## Overview

The William Novick Global Cardiac Alliance (NCA) entered 2022 with the hope that we could continue expanding our services to the children of low and middle-income countries (LMIC) following the disruptions forced on the world by the COVID pandemic. We made only 14 trips in 2020 and 2021. During this time, we operated on a total of 330 children in 5 different countries. Libya, Iraq, Russia, Ukraine, and Lebanon all received assistance during the 2 years of the pandemic.

### **Clinical Activities 2022**

We added 2 new countries in 2022, Ecuador and the Democratic Republic of Congo, and stopped our assistance to Russia secondary to the invasion of Ukraine. However, despite the war, we continued our program developing pediatric cardiac services in L'viv, making 4 trips after the invasion began on February 24<sup>th</sup>.

We completed the year with our annual Christmas trip, this time to L'viv. Dr. Novick substituted as Santa and 2 of our ICU nurses were Santa's Elves. The children received presents and sang a number of Ukrainian Christmas carols.



A total of 261 children received surgery in 2022 and an additional 35 received interventional procedures in the catheterization laboratory (L'viv only). The overall mortality for surgical cases in 2022 was 3.1%, well within the range of the programs in the US participating in the Society of Thoracic Surgery Congenital Heart Surgery Database.



## **Research and Academic Pursuits**

We have actively pursued improving the care of children in LMIC by evaluating our results, and the results achieved by the countries we assist. Analysis of the data we collect allows us to evaluate progress in these countries. Moreover, we are active in assessing the financial benefits that come when a country can care for their children with heart disease, rather than spending funds to send them abroad. Ethical principles must be adhered to in research activities, and we are cognizant that cultural issues vary and absolutely must be respected.
